



Accessing Placement Tests in Canvas

The intent of the academic placement tests at Providence College are to assess your ability in mathematics and any language you might speak, in order to place you in the most appropriate course for your skills. To access the tests, first go to <https://canvas.providence.edu> and log in with your Providence College credentials:



Google Chrome or Microsoft Edge works best with Canvas. Once you are logged in to Canvas you will initially see “tiles” for the active courses where you are enrolled. Every first year student will automatically be enrolled in “courses” for the Mathematics and Languages placement tests, and students who are Undeclared will be enrolled in a course with an Interest Survey:



If you are ever missing a course, you can click on Courses > All Courses from the sidebar to see all your course enrollments – past and future, published and unpublished:

You can check “stars” next to the courses in All Courses in order to mark them as Favorites and have them appear on your Dashboard:

Several majors (Biology, Chemistry, Economics, Marketing and others) require at least one mathematics course, and one of the requirements for graduation from Providence College is a course in "quantitative reasoning." 
