

DEGREE PLANNER Quick Tips for Students & Advisors

AT A GLANCE

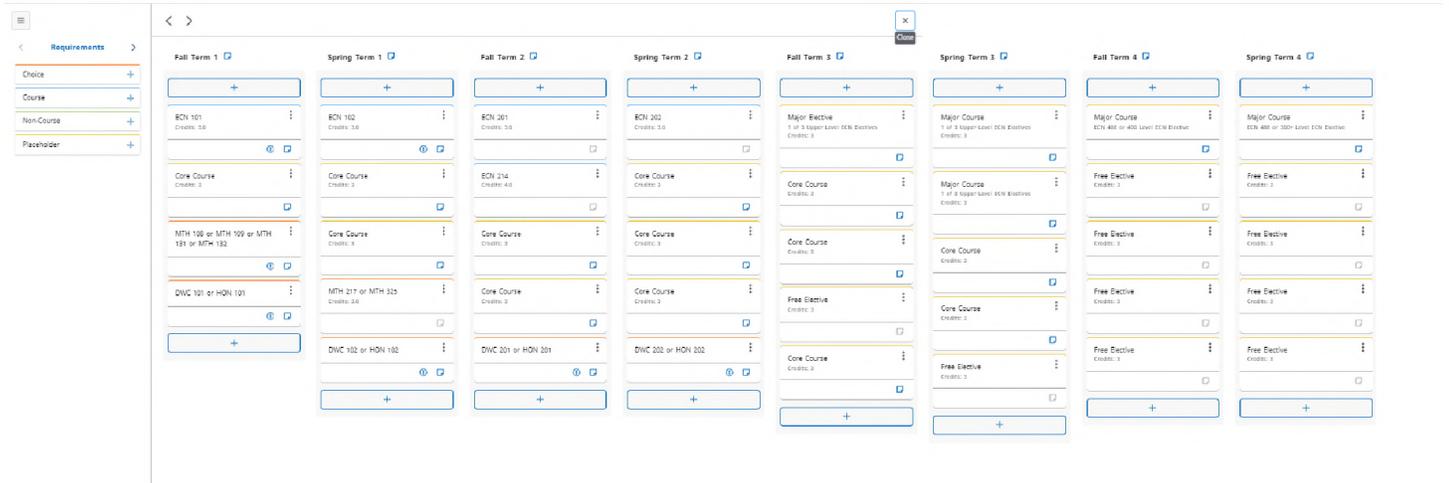
- The *Planner* is an elective companion to the degree audit and allows the student to easily view *Major Planning Templates* from the degree audit dashboard.
- The *Planner* is best utilized by first year students with 7-8 semesters of academic planning ahead but can be utilized by other students in an abbreviated manner.
- The *Degree Audit* remains the accurate accounting of degree requirements for the major, minor, and core curriculum.
- The student must take the initiative to utilize this tool and realize that their academic advisor is not responsible for formally approving student created plans.

UTILIZING THE MAJOR TEMPLATES AND BLANK PLANS

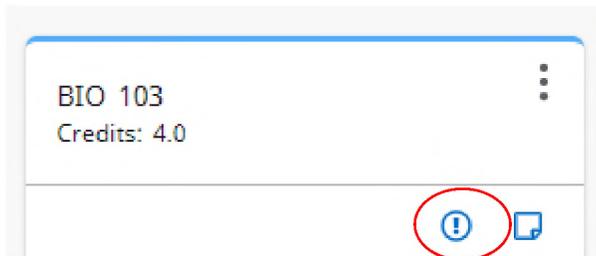
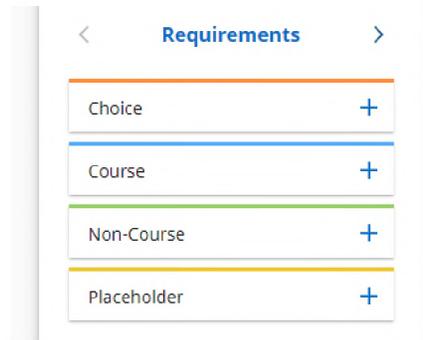
Major Planner Templates	Blank Plans
<p>The <i>Major Template</i> is an 8-semester suggested plan of study that accounts for major requirements, the core curriculum, and the number of courses necessary to reach 120 earned credits.</p> <p>Notes have been added to each <i>Major Template</i> to offer more detailed explanations on degree requirements.</p> <p>When selecting a <i>Major Template</i>, you must accurately select your class year.</p> <p>Students can add winter and summer terms as needed to either their <i>Major Template</i> or a <i>Blank Plan</i>.</p>	<p>A <i>Blank Plan</i> can be utilized to build an 8-semester (4-year) degree program with reference to the <i>Major Template</i>.</p> <p>A <i>Blank Plan</i> can be used to plan out registration options by semester.</p> <p>A <i>Blank Plan</i> allows for the incorporation of double majors and minors while referencing <i>Major Templates</i>.</p> <p>Students can add winter and summer terms as needed to either their <i>Major Template</i> or a <i>Blank Plan</i>.</p>

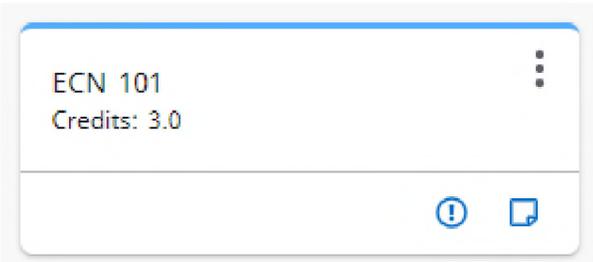

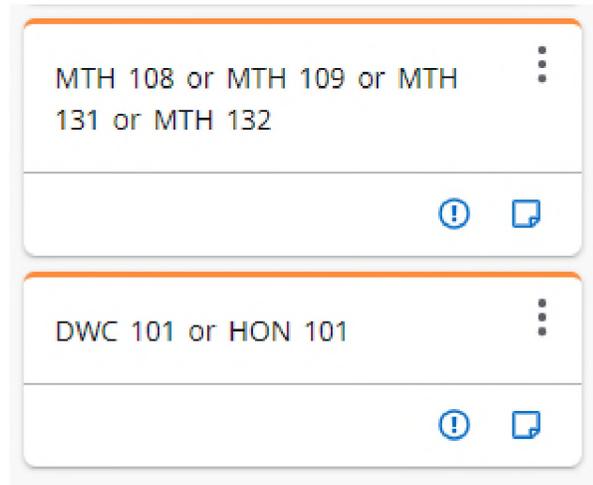
Understanding Planning Blocks



The **Blue Exclamation Point** marks a “critical course” to be taken as a pre-requisite or taken in a strongly recommended semester of study.

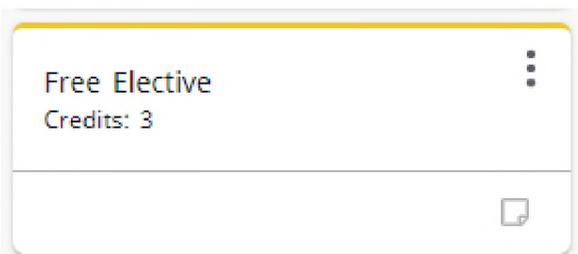


The **Blue Course Block** draws from a listing of all courses contained in the college-wide academic catalog and not from courses offered in any specific term of registration.

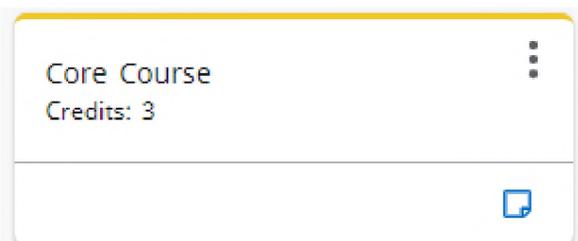


The **Orange Choice Block** represents an either/or between two courses such as DWC 101 or HON 101.

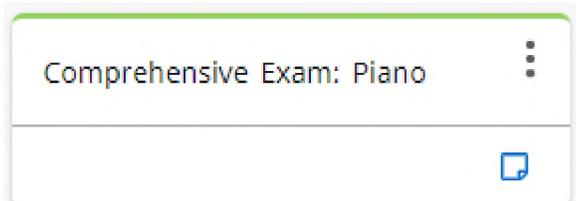
The **Yellow Placeholder Block**, frequently utilized, is for requirements that are not limited to one specific course.



Yellow Free Elective Blocks can be utilized for a second major or minor, or for free electives.

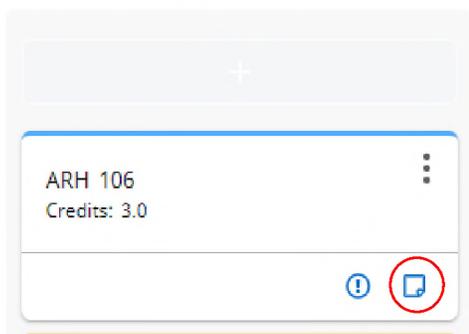


Yellow Core Blocks are planned based on student preference and course availability. The degree audit offers an accurate account of the core requirements.



The **Green Non-Course Block** is to be utilized for non-course events or obligations.
